Coast: Plants suitable for frontline coastal planting.

Dry: Plants particularly suitable for planting in areas prone to dry conditions.

Wind: Plants that will generally tolerate strong winds.

Shade: Plants that will grow with little sunlight throughout the year.

Wet: Plants that will grow in soil that is permanently boggy but not actually under water.

Water: Plants that will grow on water or in areas that are permanently under water.

Lime: Plants that will tolerate limestone soils or soils with a high PH level.

Moist: Grows best in moist, well-drained soils.
