Council has engaged SGS Economics and Planning to develop a city-wide land use strategy. This land use strategy aims to outline how and where development can occur across Warrnambool over the next 20-25 years, addressing next-generation opportunities and challenges while providing the community and developers with greater certainty and acting as a pivotal strategic document used in future planning decisions.

The project aims to meet Warrnambool's future demographic needs by addressing housing, commercial and industrial land use demand. It will consider infrastructure constraints alongside climate-wise and climate-resilient approaches. It will establish a vision for the city's development over the next 20-25 years, providing strategic direction on where and how future growth should occur to achieve a livable and resilient future for Warrnambool.
