Christmas Tree Recycling

Recycle your live Christmas tree at the Warrnambool Community Garden, cnr of Grieve Street & Derby Street, Warrnambool. Drop off in the roped area in front of the garden until 28 January 2024. Trees will be mulched and reused at the garden.

Purchase of Land for Intersection Upgrade

Council intends to purchase 482sqm of land at the corner of Goodall and McMahon streets to improve road safety conditions in the approach to the roundabout at the intersection of the two streets. Council has been working with the developer of Wollaston Way Estate and the land owner to complete the section of Goodall Street between Wollaston Road and McMahon Street.

The work will include road widening, drainage and kerb works. A footpath will also be provided on the north side. As part of the works the existing roundabout at McMahon and Goodall streets will be finalised with the existing central island enlarged to reduce traffic speeds and improve overall road safety in the area. It is anticipated that work will begin on the upgrade in early 2024.

Warrnambool Foreshore Framework Plan Have Your Sav

Warrnambool City Council, in conjunction with REALM studios are developing the Warrnambool Foreshore Framework Plan (WFFP).

The Warrnambool Foreshore Framework Plan project aims to create a shared vision and strategic plan to guide the future of the Warrnambool foreshore precinct over the next 20 years. The Framework Plan will consider strategic social, economic and environmental values of the precinct.

The Foreshore precinct Plan covers the foreshore to the south of Warrnambool's Central Business district, bordering the Lady Bay and southern ocean. It sits between the outlet of the Merri River at Stingray Bay to the west, and the Flume access point off Merri Street to the east. It is bordered by Pertobe Road to the north.
