Declaration of Boating Activity Exemption

Warrnambool City Council as the declared waterway manager for the Hopkins River between the seawards outlet and Tooram Stones under the Marine Safety Act 2010 (the Act) makes the following declaration under section 203(3) of the Act.

For the purpose of conducting the 2017 Melbourne University Boat Club and Adelaide University Boat Club Match Race on the Hopkins River, competing and rescue vessels are exempt from:

Competitors and rescue vessels during the event only:

1. Exemption from 5 knots within 50 metres of another vessel – clause 2(c);
2. Exemption from 5 knots within 50 metres of water's edge – clause 3(a);
3. Exemption from 5 knots within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water – clause 3(b); and
4. Exemption from 5 knots on the Hopkins River clause 22.2 of Schedule 22.

Rescue vessels when undertaking rescue activities only:

5. Exemption from 5 knots within 50 metres of a person in the water – clause 2(a).

Exemption Conditions

- The masters of competing vessels are exempt from items 1 – 4 above, when competing in the event.
- The event will be conducted in accordance with the Rowing Victoria Safety Management Plan.
- Under current equipment exemption arrangements competing rowers are exempt from the wearing and carrying of PFDs.
- The masters of rescue vessels are exempt from items 1 – 5 above only when undertaking a rescue operation to retrieve persons in distress, provide for their initial medical or other needs and deliver them to a place of safety on shore.
- Any designated rescue vessels must be fitted with propeller guards, in order to minimise the risk of propeller strike injury to people in the water. Vessels not designated as rescue boats that are required to assist with rescue in an emergency must turn engine off before bringing person on board.
- The exemption applies from 6am to 10am Sunday 28 May 2017, provided that the stated safety controls and undertakings detailed in the Event Application and associated documentation are adhered to.

Wurrumbit Birrng Yaar-Jubilee Park Woodford Footbridge Salvage and Reconstruction

Work will commence in late May on the salvage and reconstruction of the flood-damaged footbridge in Wurrumbit Birrng Yaar - Jubilee Park, Woodford.

The work has landowners consent and a Glenelg Hopkins Catchment Management Authority Licence.

- Once complete the reconstructed footbridge will;
- have increased structural strength;
 - be modular in design to respond to impacts and to provide cost-effective and time-efficient maintenance control; and,
 - feature a wider section of deck to allow safer passing.

Council will monitor the river level throughout the project to ensure safe working conditions. Council plans to reopen the footbridge at the earliest opportunity. Funding for this project has been sourced through the Victorian Government's Natural Disaster Funding Assistance.
