Wangoom Road North – Strategic Plan

The Wangoom Road North area is located on the northern side of Wangoom Road, between Mortlake Road and Wiggs Lane. The area is currently comprised predominately of rural land zoned Rural Living and Farming Zone.

The Warrnambool City Council has prepared a draft Land Use Options Summary report for the area.

The report has explored the area's capacity for further residential growth and also includes an analysis of drainage and flooding, a traffic impact assessment, and an investigation into potential servicing impacts.

The report also considers landowner expectations and aspirations, which were obtained through a community survey and community consultation meeting held in August 2017.
