Vegetation Clearing in Vicinity of Power Line Conductors

Under the Code of Practice for Electric Line Clearance Council must maintain vegetation clearance around power lines in compliance with the Electricity Safety (Electric Line Clearance) Regulations 2020. Council is hereby giving notice that trimming of vegetation on public land within the declared area of the City will be conducted over the next 60 days in order to maintain the required clearance space around power lines prescribed by the Code. Edwards (Stanley Street) Bridge – new load limit

Following maintenance works on Edwards Bridge the load limit for the bridge has been revised from 20 tonnes to 15 tonnes. This limit will affect certain commercial vehicles and buses and will not affect passenger vehicles, including passenger vehicles towing trailers or caravans. If vehicles over 15t require special needs access they can apply to Council for consideration of an exception permit.

Changes to bottle bank locations

From September 1, all Warrnambool residents will be able to drop off household glass for free at Statewide Recycling in Koroit Street (near the showgrounds).

This system will replace the three bottle banks currently located at Bunnings, Norfolk Plaza and Dennington Plaza.

It's been amazing to see just how popular the bottle banks have been since they were introduced earlier this year.

About six tonnes of glass from the bottle banks was crushed and used to help rebuild Walsh Road recently, so this is a great example of a local resource being reused on a local project.

We've reached a point though that the bottle banks are regularly overflowing and it's difficult – and costly – to keep up with the demand.

So we're encouraging everyone to bring their glass directly to Statewide to remove the cost of a truck regularly picking up glass from the bottle banks.

The people taking the time to collect and transport their glass to the bottle banks are probably among the city's most passionate recyclers and we hope that the change in drop-off location won't dampen this passion.

This arrangement will help reduce glass contamination of our recyclable material while we continue to roll out our separate kerbside glass collection service across the whole of Warrnambool early next year.

If you don't want to bring your glass to Statewide, please continue to place it in your yellow-lidded recycling bin until you have a purple-lidded glass bin.
