Warrnambool Fox Baiting Program

The Warrnambool fox baiting program will be undertaken on Council managed land west of Warrnambool Sewage Treatment Plant, to assist in protecting native wildlife, including threatened species from foxes.

Foxecute, PAPP (para-aminopropiophenone) poison baits have been laid and will be in place until Friday July 10, 2020.

Baits will be buried to reduce the risk of non-target poisoning.

Warning signs will be displayed to notify the public of the program.

Pet owners and their pets (including dogs on lead) should avoid the baited area during and up to four weeks after the fox baiting program. Immediate vet assessment is required for any pet suspected of PAPP poisoning.

The Vet Group Wollaston, 59 Mortlake Rd Warrnambool, 5561 6911, and Warrnambool Veterinary Clinic, 514 Raglan Parade, 5559 0222, stock an antidote to the poison.

PAPP poison can be lethal to dogs and cats. Pet owners are advised not enter the baited Council managed land west of the Warrnambool Sewage Treatment Plant with their pets from now until Friday August 7, 2020.
