BONE HEALTH INFO SESSION

Bone is living tissue that is constantly being broken down and replaced. Osteoporosis occurs when the creation of new bone doesn't keep up with the loss of old bone and bones become weak and brittle, so brittle that a fall or even mild stresses such as bending over or coughing can cause a break. Osteoporosis related breaks most commonly occur in the hip, wrist or spine.

Come along and hear from the team at Monaghan's Pharmacy about medication, healthy diet and weight-bearing exercises to help prevent bone loss or strengthen already weak bones.
