ASSISTANCE ANIMALS CONCESSION CARDS NATIONAL RELAY SERVICE ASSISTIVE EQUIPMENT

Category One: Blue

A blue parking permit entitles a person to park in a parking area or bay designated for use by people with disabilities, for the time specified for that area.

Category Two: Green

A green parking permit allows a person to park in any regular parking bay for twice the amount of time indicated by the sign.

Eligibility

A person can be eligible for only one permit based on the assessment of their need for assistance.

An "A" Permit is applicable to disabled drivers/passengers. A "B" permit applies to passengers only.

Changing **Places**

Changing Places amenities are best practice design facilities which provide people with a disability access to bath-rooms that are large, safe, clean and accessible.

Each facility has an adjustable height, adult-sized changing bench, a tracking hoist system, and enough space for two people.

A Changing Places facility is located at the eastern end of the Lake Pertobe Adventure Playground.
