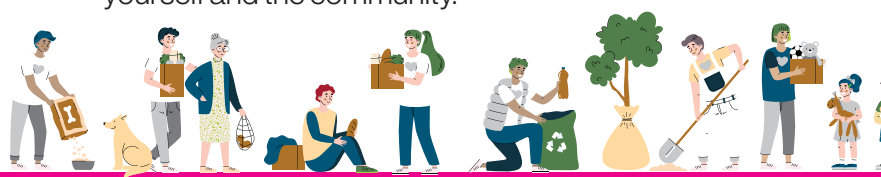
She enjoys the flexibility that she has at the Warrnambool Art Gallery, and she encouraged
