

Kitchen caddies and liners

A kitchen caddy is a container to store your food waste in before you empty it into your Food Organics & Garden Organics (FOGO) bin outside.

You can use any container that works for you. Ice-cream containers and yoghurt buckets work just as well as council provided caddies, or you may prefer to buy a caddy that matches your kitchen décor.

Place all your food waste into your kitchen caddy loose or use a liner. You can make a liner from newspaper or use a certified compostable bag or liner.

Thank you for only using newspaper or certified compostable bags or liners for food waste.



Certified compostable bags and liners carry the seedling logo. This logo tells you that the product meets Australian Standard 4736 for commercially compostable items.



Plastics, including 'degradable' 'biodegradable' or 'oxodegradable' are NOT accepted. These plastics break up into millions of tiny plastic pieces called micro-plastics. They do not compost and they contaminate the FOGO.









How to fold a newspaper liner



Overlap 2-3 layers of newspaper to make a square



Fold in half to make a triangle



Fold points in to make a diamond



Fold points in to make a diamond



Open out to triangle and note crease



Fold point to opposite crease



Fold point to opposite crease



Fold down flap



Flip over and fold down flap
