Notice of Intention To Lease

In accordance with Section 190 of the Local Government Act 1989 the Warrnambool City Council gives notice of its intention to enter into a lease agreement with the Department of Transport for a site off Gilles Street, Warrnambool. The proposed lease is for a 2 year period. The proposed purpose of the lease is for upgrade works on the Geelong to Warrnambool railway line. The initial rental is determined by Council based on current ground rental valuation.

Public Submissions

Under Section 223 of the Local Government Act a person has a right to make a submission in writing to the Warrnambool City Council on the proposed lease. The Council will consider the submissions in accordance with Section 223.

Submissions in writing to this proposal should be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer, Warrnambool Civic Centre, PO Box 198, Warrnambool 3280 to be received no later than 2pm, Friday 24 April 2020.

Any person making a written submission who wishes to be heard in support of their submission, must include this in their request and they will be heard before a Special Committee of Council convened for that purpose. Notice is given that subject to consideration of any written submission received in accordance with this notice, Council intends to lease this property.
