To reduce the impact of increased stormwater run-off on the drainage system and to facilitate on-site
stormwater infiltration.
DECISION CHIEFLINES
DECISION GUIDELINES
The reporting authority may give its consent to an application for a building permit for a principal
single dwelling or a small second dwelling (as applicable) that does not comply with Regulation 77
(Permeability) of the Regulations if at least one of the following criteria apply;
a) The amount of impermeable surfaces after the principal single dwelling or small second dwelling
has been constructed would be consistent with existing development on the allotment, if
applicable; or

b) The capacity of the drainage system servicing the allotment is able to accommodate the additional stormwater that the development will cause; or

c) On-site stormwater retention is able to accommodate the additional stormwater that the development will cause.
Comment:
In this Guideline, <i>drainage system</i> includes the relevant local council's drainage system, Melbourne Water Corporation's drainage system (if relevant) and the receiving waterways into which the stormwater flows.

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
